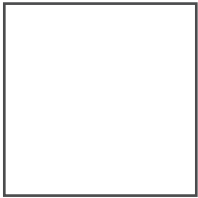

Learn how to prepare for a visit from ICE, including: proper I-9 preparation and retention, responding to an ICE I-9 audit, and preparing for an ICE raid.
